

Cocoa Reflection



Why does it matter whether or not we buy Fairtrade? This meditation, drawn from our experience visiting cocoa farmers, gives background to help people understand why Fairtrade is needed. First you plant the seed and tend it. Shelter it. Water it. Wait until the sapling Is ready to plant In soil you have prepared.

Then you surround it With plants that will shade But not overcrowd it And you wait For years Feeding the soil, Watching its branches and leaves, Protecting them from insects, As it grows And matures Until finally the pod bursts from the bark And swells Thick with seeds and fibres And is ready to be picked.

Then you break open the pod Scoop out the beans, Ferment them, Spread them to dry On a table. You turn them with your hands, Running your fingers Through the rich, brown harvest, Sorting, searching out The bean that is not quite right, Cherishing the others.

And then you sell the beans Hoping That the money they bring Will provide for your daughters and sons.

But what if buyers take your precious beans And give you in return So little money That it will not cover your family's needs And there is not enough for school, Or medicines when you need them, Or access to clean water Or good food for the table?

What if As the heat soars And floods rise And pests multiply Your return gets smaller and smaller And your care for the land Seems to mean nothing.

What if, each day As you walk towards the trees, The question comes, unbidden, insistent: How will we survive?
